Directors'/Officers' reports:

Band (Mr. Busch-Director of Bands) Not present **Jazz Band** (Mr. Guerrero-Asst. Director of Bands)

- Mini band camp held last week for two days. 50 students attended. Thank you for the upper classman that came to help teach and support the freshman.
- Pirates of the Caribbean will be our show music for this year.
- We continue to work along with the administration and all the instructors of music from grade 6-12 to come up with a plan for the future for vocal music and instrumental music during Covid.
- Most recent part of the aerosol study was a little more specific about the air quality with vocal and band instruments. There is some discussion about using filters on the bells of the instruments to catch particles that might be released. The facilities people are working on ways to make sure the air exchange in the buildings are on-line with the recommended amount. It was recommended in the study that students wear a mask with a slit in them to have access to their mouthpiece. It is unsure how that will relate with the order from the Governor's office for everyone to wear masks while indoors. Discussion is happening between the WSMA, teachers and governor's office to find out if masks with a slit in school would be permitted. This study is also still ongoing and will continue to do research and release their results.
- We are looking at curriculum designed for virtual use, we are looking at curriculum designed for asynchronous use.
- A question was raised about holding band/choir classes outside. This is something that has been discussed. Options are being discussed that will be best for the district and students. The instruction and safety/cleanliness of our area for our students is paramount for this year. Many different things are being discussed from using "puppy pads" to avoid spit on the floor or surgical covers for shoes.
- It was clarified that if there is no football, then that will affect whether there will be marching band. We
 have the music but not the drill for a field show. If we end up doing a field show, that will be taught
 during the school year.
